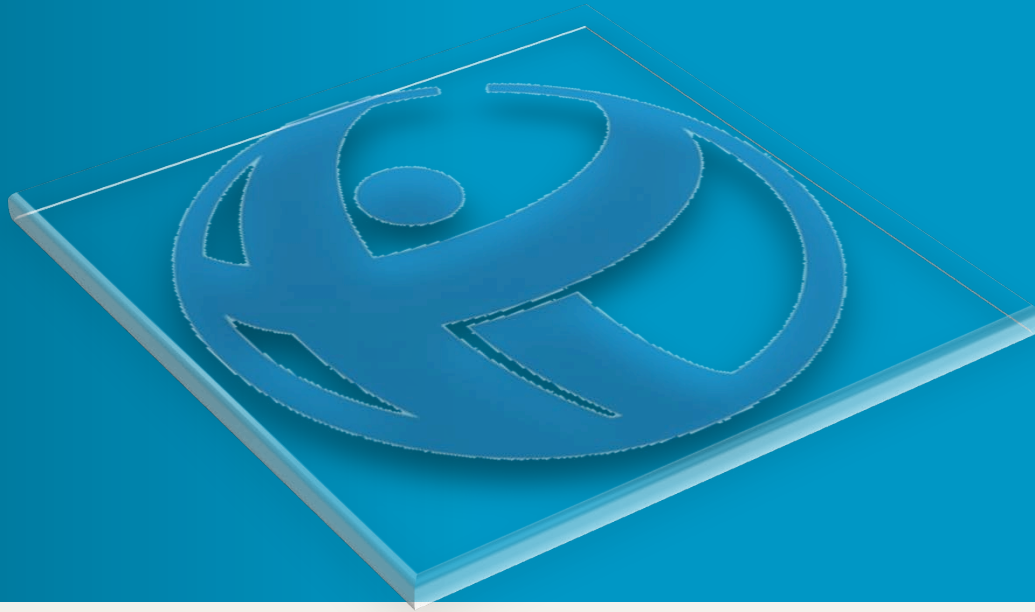

Marcia Ayers-Caesar says her removal as a High Court Judge is "unlawful and unconstitutional" as she was put under pressure to resign. Because of this, Ayers-Caesar says her resignation letter is "of no legal effect".

United Nations Global Compact

10%

Corruption raises project costs for companies by an average of **10%**.

20%

Moving business from a country with a low level of corruption to a country with medium or high level of **corruption** is found to be the equivalent of a **20%** tax on foreign business.

25%

Corruption adds **25%** to the **cost of procurement contracts** in developing countries.

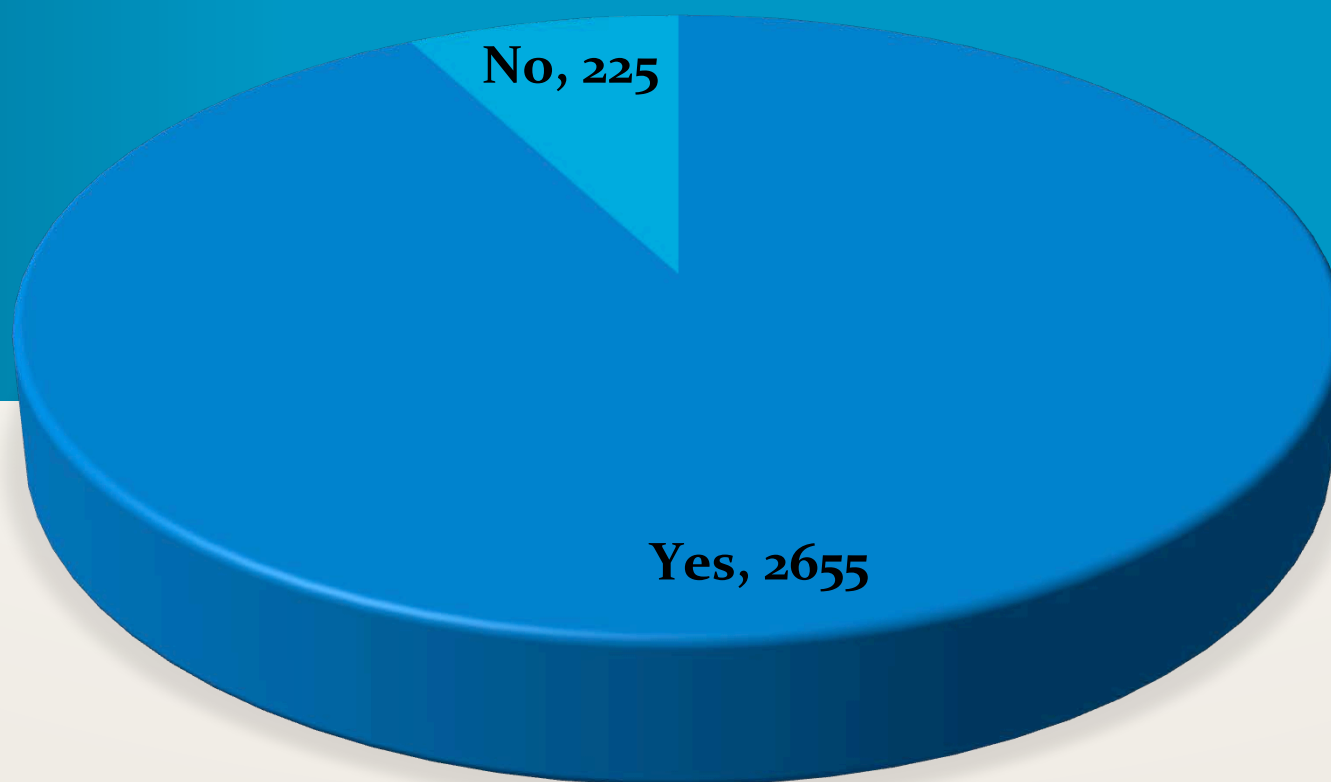

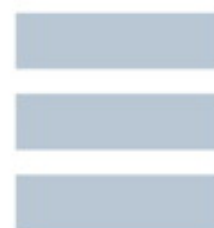
